Preparing a Constitution for KTCC

This is a guideline to write a Constitution for a Kids That Care Club (KTCC). It is used as a framework and can be altered as needed. All KTCC Clubs must have a Constitution and should be kept on file with your advisor.

Constitution of: (Name of Club)

Article I

Name of organization: The name is placed in the body of the constitution as well as in the title.

Article II

Purpose and Objectives: State them as clearly and specifically as possible. This article should answer the questions. "What is the primary objective of this KTCC Club being formed?"

Article III

Qualifications of Members: Cover eligibility of membership. Include a clause, which states the open membership policy of the college, which is: "Membership will not be denied to any student on the basis of race, creed, color, gender, religion or sexual orientation".

Article IV

Officers and Committees: Include tittles of officers and committees, their duties and function, method of election or appointment. A suggested list of officers includes a president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer.

Article V

Meetings: Include how often meetings will be held, definitions of a quorum, and a procedure for holding special meetings. You may want to include a section which reads:

"The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order shall govern this organization in all cases in which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the constitution.

Article VI

Finances: State if there will be dues. If there are to be dues indicate amount and means of collection. You should include a section as follows: "All monies collected must be deposited within two business days to the bursar in the organization's account. There will be no outside bank accounts permitted."

Article VII

Termination of membership, resignation and non-active members: Indicate specifically the rules governing these.

Article VIII

Amendments: State clearly what notices prior to the voting on the amendment are required. Also state the number of affirmative votes necessary for passage of an amendment.
